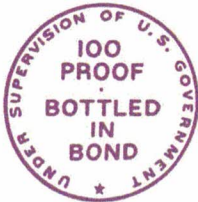
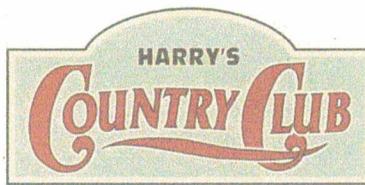

***"Bottled in Bond?"***



Early whiskey in the United States quickly became vulnerable to distillers creating an adulterated product, blended with juices and water, that was designed to stretch the profit. So, in the late 19th century distillers rallied together with the Government to pass the "Bottle in Bond Act of 1897", one of the first consumer protection laws, to signify to the consumer that what they were tasting was "pure" and "authentic" whiskey.

A "bonded" label issued by the government means a whiskey is: distilled at one distillery in one distilling season, at least 4 years old, bottled at 100 proof, and includes the distiller and distillery on the label. Have your taste today!
